Special adoption prices for all Chihuahuas one year old and up all month long

PHOENIX – Throughout the month of May at HALO Animal Rescue, all Chihuahua and Chihuahua mixes older than one year are \$50 or less as the rescue aims to increase the number of Chihuahuas placed in loving homes.

Last year, HALO helped save the lives of more than 7,000 pets, and Chihuahuas currently make up more than 40 percent of dogs in HALO's shelter. HALO hopes that this promotion will bring more awareness to this popular breed and help even more Chihuahuas find forever homes.

"There are so many loving Chihuahuas in our care," said Heather Allen, President and CEO of HALO Animal Rescue. "They are a very popular breed and we strive to bring attention to how many of them currently need families to call their own."

The Aye Chihuahua promotion is available at all three HALO Animal Rescue adoption facilities across the Valley: HALO's main shelter at 2500 S. 27th Avenue; Metro Mall Adoption Center at 9617 N. Metro Parkway West; and PetSmart Everyday Adoption Center at 2901 W. Agua Fria Freeway.

"All Chihuahuas who are more than one year old are included in this special pricing," added Allen. "Sometimes a small dog is the perfect pet for someone, and we have so many great ones to choose from. We know that by promoting these adoption specials, more dogs will find the homes they need."

Founded in 1994, HALO Animal Rescue is the largest no-kill animal shelter in Maricopa County and is housed in the west campus of Maricopa Animal Care and Control. Through this partnership, HALO is able to work directly with pets who come in through the county system to find them new homes. In the past 20 years, HALO has helped save the lives of nearly 40,000 pets.
